The Frederick R. Weisman Museum of Art presents *Gwynn Murrill: Animal Nature*

(Malibu, CA—May 17, 2022) Pepperdine University's Frederick R. Weisman Museum of Art presents the exhibition *Gwynn Murrill: Animal Nature*. For more than 50 years, Los Angeles-based artist Gwynn Murrill has been sculpting animals, striking a balance in her work between abstraction and realism. Developed in close collaboration with the artist, *Gwynn Murrill: Animal Nature* takes a retrospective look at her wide-ranging oeuvre. The exhibition features

early works from the 1970s carved from wood, alongside more recent work—including sculptures that merge animal and human forms—made in bronze, wood, marble, and clay.

Inspired in part by the contours of the Santa Monica Mountains, where Murrill has made her home for several decades, her smooth, streamlined forms capture the vitality of the animals she sculpts. Through close observation in real life and through photographs, Murrill pares animals down to their formal essences, conveying movement and personality through elegant, minimal gestures. In transforming observation into sculpture, Murrill also pays close attention to the space around her works, creating relationships between her animals that activate so-called negative space and emphasize the dynamism of these elusive living creatures.



In conjunction with the exhibition, the Weisman Museum has produced a coloring book designed by recent Pepperdine University graduate Carson Vandermade, with drawings based on Murrill's sculptures.

Gwynn Murrill: Animal Nature was initiated by the late Michael R. Zakian, director of the Weisman Museum of Art from 1995 to 2020, and curated by the museum's current director, Andrea Gyorody.

Weisman Foundation.

Located on Pepperdine's Malibu campus, the museum is open Tuesday–Sunday, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., and is closed on Mondays and major holidays. Admission is always free and advance reservations are no longer required.
